Read the extract carefully and answer the questions below. It is a description of Bournemouth in England.

July had been blown out like a candle by the biting wind that ushered in a leaden August sky. A sharp, stinging drizzle fell, billowing into opaque grey sheets when the wind caught it. Along the Bournemouth sea-front the beach-huts turned bland wooden faces towards a greeny-grey, froth-chained sea that leapt eagerly at the cement bulwark of the shore. The gulls had been tumbled inland over the town, and they now drifted above the housetops on taut wings, whining peevishly. It was the sort of weather calculated to try anyone's endurance.

Question 1: Write one detailed paragraph about your impression of the weather from this passage.

Question 2: The extract comes from the beginning of a novel. Continue the story. Write one or two paragraphs. You do not need to finish the story.
